backing up. It was not certain whether this work had been passed by a Building Control Officer.

MOP raised the landscaping of the site was inadequate. The current lodges look straight into neighbouring houses some of which are listed buildings.

DM – asked if the currently sited lodge is placed legally. It was understood that the location plan hadn't been agreed. SB - said that the single lodge could be on the site until the location plan is agreed.

DC/22/05095 – this plan didn't have a highways report submitted with it the new application does have a highways report objecting to the 9 lodges.

Environmental survey - stated no burning, construction hours and anti-social behaviour have not been followed into the approved application. MH will follow up on this case.

It was noted that the Highways agenda had not submitted a report for DC/22/05095 -Consultees are not legally required to give a response.

MH gave assurance that DC/23/03685 would go to committee and wouldn't be an officer

MH to forward copy of his reports and that from Cllr Gould to be included in these minutes.

DM asked about the bus route. It wasn't a subsidised bus which is the reason why it was pulled. MH said that they purchase the seats for children that qualify for those bus routes. The bus operator pulled the route due to it not being financially viable.

Appendix A

DC/23/03685 - Land At, Hoxne Road, Denham - Full Planning Application - Use of land for the stationing of 9no. Holiday Lodges (following demolition of existing building)

Denham Parish Council's view is to object to this application. In so doing we make the following comments.

1. This matter is conjoined with an already granted planning permission (subject to discharge of conditions) reference DC/22/05095 We note that MSDC has (at the date of writing) refused discharge of two conditions (plan for foul drainage and plan for site layout/landscaping).

Denham Parish Council formally objected to the granting of DC/22/05095. Denham Parish council noted at that time that that application suffered from a number of inaccuracies and was ill-conceived. The application DC/23/03685 suffers from all of the drawbacks of the previous planning application, and simply increase the problems around the site by 180%.

With regards the granting of DC/22/05095 Denham Parish Council note that:

- i) Suffolk Highways did not appear to have been consulted/responded as no response has been displayed in MSDC's planning portal from Suffolk Highways; and
- ii) the proposed conditions that were set out by the Environmental Officer (Susan Lennard) were not incorporated into the grant of planning permission. These were:
  - a) Construction Hours, limited to 0800 and 18000 Mon to Fri and 0900 and 1600 Saturday (no working on

Sunday)

- b) Prohibition on Burning on Site
- c) Requirement for Noise Assessment
- d) Requirement for Submission of Site Management Plan; and
- e) Agreed scheme for external lighting.
- f) Stipulation on height of any flues

The failure to incorporate or even reference this environmental report in the full planning grant DC/22/05095 has exposed residents of Denham to harm and is borderline negligent.

The failure to ensure that Suffolk Highways report was received and referenced in the full planning grant DC/22/05095 has exposed residents of Denham to harm and is borderline negligent.

Denham Parish Council has formally asked ClIr Hicks to investigate and explain why the above two steps were not taken.

2. Since the commencement of construction under DC/22/05095, there have been instances of: late night and weekend noisy working, surface area flooding and foul water backing up sewers, fires on site (one damaging UK Power Networks infrastructure) with attendance of Suffolk Fire and Rescue, as well as Suffolk Constabulary and Suffolk child protection services.

Residents have also been visited by members of Suffolk Constabulary who are undertaking "welfare checks" due to comments made you the landowner.

- 3. Further to point 2 above, there is an ongoing enforcement action against the landowner / developer of the site by MSDC for:
  - i) Failure to comply with a stop notice; and
  - ii) Failure to comply with/ discharge planning conditions

Denham Parish council understand that this matter has been remitted to court for prosecution. Denham Parish Council understand that a PCN has been served on the landowner and he has responded in time.

4. Denham Parish Council notes and welcomes the comments and objections of Suffolk Highways in respect of DC/23/03685 and agrees that the likely level of traffic caused by stationing 9 lodges (with 18 car parking spaces), is unsustainable, dangerous and would lead to loss of amenity to residents.

Denham Parish Council would go so far as to opine that the analysis undertaken by Suffolk Highways for DC/23/03685 is equally applicable to DC/22/05095 and that 5 lodges (with 10 car parking spaces) is also unsustainable, dangerous and would lead to loss of amenity to residents.

For the above reasons Denham Parish Council objects to DC/23/03685 and its position is that the granting of DC/22/05095 was highly irregular and flawed.
